JASPER MORRISON: TAKE A SEAT!

Musées des Arts Décoratifs Paris, France until 24 May

Dispensing with the rocket science that chairs come in all shapes and sizes, those designed by Jasper Morrison are seen by many designers as an inspirational source of reference. This exhibition aims to bring the language of his seating to a wider audience, giving the designer a canvas on which to show 21 chairs, aligned, one next to another, without the usual "look but don't touch' sentiment so visitors can enjoy the visual and physical experience. Aesthetic and functional, featured chair models include the Thinking Man's Chair (1986) for Cappellini and the Basel Chair (2008) by Vitra, reminiscent of the classic school chair. www.lesartsdecoratifs.fr
